
Gibloux Marsens

NORDIC RÉGION GIBLOUX TRAIL Snowshoe trail (Purple Trail P-Q-N-L-S-P)

Located on the south face of the Gibloux, our snowshoe trails offer an idyllic setting in winter. Between peat bogs, pastures and forests, you might think you are in Lapland. The view of the Moléson and the Pre-Alps is there to remind us that we are in Gruyère. Various starting points are accessible by car from Riaz, Marsens, Sorens (TPF Bus) and Maules.


Discover the **Purple Trail** and the Hills of Marsens.

From point P "Petit Prary", follow the road on the left up to the entrance of the forest. Then follow the path along the creek to the crossing. Go straight ahead towards point N "Passerelle des Bugnons" (then L "Les Gurles") across the snow-covered plain, then cross over the cross-country ski trail towards the forest. The path then turns right towards point S "L'Obeca". Walk over a small bridge and walk along the Etang des Bugnons. At the edge of the woods, cross over the cross-country ski slope again and go up to the left following the pink signposts. Once you have left the forest, cross over the final descent, enjoy a magnificent view of the Vanils mountain range and the Moléson.

More connections are possible (in orange):

- 1. Connection Camping de Sorens (T) (1.4 km.)
- 2. Connection Les Mottes (R) (270 m.)
- 3. Connection Chalet Neuf à Riaz (A) (800 m.)
- 4. Connection Maules (M) (1.8 km.)

This unprepared itinerary is marked. You take this trail at your own risk. Snowshoeing is done in the mountains, therefore, certain rules must be respected for your safety.
