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WELCOME TO THE CANTON OF JURA!

Jura is an area of unspoilt countryside in north-western Switzerland.

SPORTS AND LEISURE

This region of rolling hills dotted with picturesque towns and villages is full of things to see and do. It's a haven for outdoor sports throughout the year, with plenty to offer visitors of all tastes and abilities. With golf, competitive rocking climbing, canoeing, all-terrain scooters, horse riding, cross-country skiing in winter, mountain biking and more, Jura boasts a wide range of activities in magnificent surroundings. And if you prefer to strike out and see the countryside in all its glory, you can explore the unspoilt surroundings along more than 1,000 km of footpaths.

THE HOME OF EQUESTRIAN TOURISM

Jura is the home of Switzerland's only native horse breed, the Franches-Montagnes (or Freiberger), and there are plenty of ways to enjoy the area from the saddle, including horse-and-wagon rides and our traditional fondue and gourmet dining trips, along with stud tours, traditional Romani horse-drawn caravans, and more

WATCH MAKING

Watch making was invented in Jura, and here you'll learn about all things time-keeping. The museum at the Espace Paysan Horloger tells the story of modern watch making, and the Watch Case Museum and the Watch-Making Foundation provide a fascinating insight into this quintessential Swiss craft. And in our watchmaking workshops you can even have a go at assembling your very own timepiece to take home!

CULTURAL ATTRACTIONS

Another great way to get under the skin of Jura is to experience some of our wide range of cultural activities. For culture vultures, our region boasts no end of museums, art galleries – both classical and contemporary, open-air exhibitions such as the Balade de Séprais sculpture park, and historical attractions galore. For example, did you know that Jura is home to the highest concentration of modern stained-glass art in Western Europe?

And if historical buildings are your thing, it's worth taking the time to seek out some of our beautifully preserved traditional Jura towns and villages such as Delémont, Porrentruy and the picture-postcard medieval village of Saint-Ursanne, the 'Pearl of the Doubs'.

EVENTS

Because Jura is such as small, intimate canton, you're never far from a warm, friendly village welcome from the locals. This is your chance to get stuck in and experience the traditions of Jura up close and personal, all year round. Get togged out in fancy dress for Jura Carnival, join us for a hearty feast on Saint Martin's Day, head back to the Middle Ages in Saint-Ursanne, and get drawn into the excitement at the Saignelégier equestrian exhibition and horse-racing event.

FREE PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Stay at least one night in Jura and you'll qualify for the JURA-PASS, which entitles you to FREE public transport and reduced admission to a host of activities!

AROUND AND ABOUT BY BIKE

Jura is THE place to see from the saddle! Like mountain biking, gravel riding or e-bikes? Then Jura is for you! Explore every nook and cranny of the region on hundreds of kilometres of waymarked routes, from rolling hills to wooded pastureland, dreamy villages and (almost) enchanted forests.

ROUTE NO.3 - JURA BIKE

Just a stone's throw from central Delémont the rolling hills begin. Your route climbs towards the Rangiers Mountains, and from the col of the same name you whizz down into the deep Doubs Valley. The final stretch potters along the riverside, ending in the medieval village of Saint-Ursanne.

ROUTE NO.7 - JURA ROUTE

Jura Route runs alongside the mysterious River Doubs, taking in the medieval village of Saint-Ursanne, followed by some tough climbs up to the high plains of Franches-Montagnes. The sweeping, peaceful scenery includes meadows, fir forests, grazing cattle and horses.

Home to a mix of wooded pastureland and sweeping landscapes, Jura is a haven of peace and quiet for the semi-feral horses that roam the countryside here. It is also an equestrian paradise for both regular riders and visitors who come here to have their first experiences with horses. Several farms organise guided hacks and pony trekking for riders of all abilities, plus stud tours and excursions in horse-drawn carts and carriages.

THE RIDGES OF FRANCHES-MONTAGNES

A walk on the Franches-Montagnes plateau that picks its way along ridges, through wooded pastures and past quaint hamlets, taking in sweeping views of Jura Mountains.

VAL TERBI TRAIL

This hike in the upper Val Terbi includes the climb up to the Welschgätterli Pass. This rocky Alpine col, on the 'border' between the French- and German-speaking parts of Switzerland, Treats hikers to a panoramic view of the Delémont Valley and the Basel and Solothurn regions. And there are some gorgeous picnic spots along the way.

This walk marks 'Kilometre Zero', the southernmost point on the Western Front that ran all the way from the Swiss border to the North Sea during the First World War. In the forest here you'll come across the remains of military barricades, observation posts and bunkers. The walk crosses the border at several points.





Recently, Jura has become the stamping ground of a famous animal worthy of the Wild West... Can you guess which one? The Buffalo!

Have you ever wished you could walk with confidence among a great herd of buffalo? Well, here you can! The Parc à Bisons in Boncourt, a pretty town right on the French border, is a great family attraction where you can get up close and personal to Europe's largest land mammal – weighing up to 1,200 kg!

Réclère

PRÉHISTO-PARC

West of Porrentruy, right on the French border near the tiny village of Réclère, embark on a fascinating journey through time at Préhisto-Parc.

Préhisto-Parc is an exciting 2km dinosaur trail through the woods. Go back millions of years in time as you explore the trail, Coming across no fewer than 45 lifesize dinosaur models that follow the evolution of these incredible beasts. And from the high observation tower you are treated to amazing views of the meandering Doubs Valley.

TRAIL NO.303 PISTE DES PREMIERS FLOCONS - CROSS-COUNTRY SKIING

A superb circular route around an area with an excellent snow record. The trail winds its way through the wooded pasturelands so typical of Les Breuleux. Lots of variety, with a perfect mix of wide open spaces and tree-lined sections.



A CHEESE WITH SOMETHING OF A REPUTATION.

TÊTE DE MOINE AOP

Tête de Moine AOP cheese has been made for centuries in the village of Bellelay. It is served in very thin rosettes pared off using a tool invented especially – the girolle. At La Maison de la Tête de Moine AOP you can watch the cheese being made in a large copper vat according to a traditional method used by the monks who first made it centuries ago. Or join a guided tour at the cheese dairies at Le Noirmont, Les Reussilles and Saignelégier to see how Tête de Moine AOP is made the modern way.

DAMASSINE AOP

According to legend, knights returning from a crusade brought with them a little red plum they had found in Damascus – the damson. The locals soon developed a taste for the fruit spirit distilled from its juices. The chalky soils and climate here suit the damson down to the ground, bringing out the essence of its delicate flavours. The result? Damassine eau de vie, certified AOP for its high quality, which flies the flag for the canton of Jura and the Ajoie region.
