



Coming to Nendaz





Shuttle buses

The shuttle buses (only on reservation) are organized to quickly and easily access numerous walks in the heart of the surrounding nature. One runs between Haute-Nendaz and Veysonnaz from the 9th of May to the 26th of October (everyday throughout the high season; Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays between seasons). Another shuttle bus runs between Haute-Nendaz and Siviez on the weekend from the 8th of June to the 16th of June as well as from Thursday to Sunday from the 3rd to the 27th of October, the CarPostal ensuring this service throughout the high summer season.

In short, Nendaz is...

A municipality with

- A territory of 85.9 km² between 492 and 3,336 metres above sea level
- 17 villages
- A holiday resort, Haute-Nendaz, of 18,807 beds
- A population of 7,012 inhabitants over the whole municipality
- A population of over 2,000 habitants all-year-round in Haute-Nendaz.

Holiday accommodation

- Hotels and guest houses: 372 beds
- Group accommodation: 320 beds
- Holiday apartments and chalets:
 18,000 beds (of which
 4,000 are rented)
- Mountain cabins: 25 beds
- B&B: 90 beds.

CHARACTERISTICS OF THE DESTINATION

More than 3 out of 4 commercial overnight stays are in chalets and holiday apartments. It should be noted that for this category, Nendaz Tourisme only considers the overnight stays made through rental agencies. However, many overnight stays are also made in holiday homes, either by their owners who are very loyal to Nendaz, or by weekly or seasonal guests.

Where our guests come from (commercial overnight stays)*

Guests having generated commercial overnight stays in Nendaz came in 2023 from 73 different countries. 93% of these commercial overnight stays were, however, generated by the five priority markets in Nendaz Tourisme's marketing strategy, i.e. Switzerland, BeNeLux, Germany, the UK and France.

22-year-old Rita enjoys spending time in the mountains and really appreciates the peace and quiet. She, therefore, allowed herself to be tempted by the adventure of the short version of 'Nendaz Trekking' to explore the region in a different way and at her own pace. Convincing her boyfriend to join her took no time at all: he also enjoys natural surroundings, so he didn't hesitate a single moment at the prospect of three days away from it all. Both him and Rita are used to walking, but usually on short hikes, never more than 4 hours and with little variation in altitude. So, it was also an opportunity to set a small chal-

lenge together. Indeed, the 'Petit Nendaz Trekking', is a tour in the summits of about 40 kilometres over three days with two overnight mountain cabin stays and roughly 4,5 to 5 hours walking per day.

On the first day, the young couple set off uphill towards Thyon departing from Veysonnaz very motivated and at a good pace. It is possible to shorten the itinerary by taking the gondola. But Rita and her companion didn't want to do so: they were eager to follow this challenge in its entirety!

The young woman doesn't try to hide the fact that, the second day was a little more difficult: again the day begins with an uphill passage: «We took longer than intended and it was a little difficult. But it was so worth it. When I arrived at the top of Mont-Rouge, I had tears in my eyes as it was so breathtakingly beautiful.» The passage along the bisse de Chervé and the turquoise water of the Cleuson dam also amazed her. And the third day, the itinerary was less demanding with a wonderful walk through the forest along the bisse de Saxon.

Rita points out that she loves animals. Even if she hadn't mentioned this, it would be easy to guess: throughout her account, she often comes enthusiastically back to the various encounters she enjoyed with the local fauna: squirrels along the first big climb, marmots which she spotted in the morning and at the end the day, the cows in front of the Essertze mountain cabin which made this place even more magical and then, on the last day, the cherry on the cake, some fawns observed in the forest.

Three questions to Rita

What did you enjoy the most during this experience?

Stopping just a moment to enjoy and listen to true silence. We often said to each other «shhh». I was shocked when I came back to town; I realized that even in my home, there is always some kind of noise. It was also pleasant to completely disconnect, to only use our phones to take photos or videos.

What surprised you most?

I was expecting to see nice views, I had seen a few photos before setting out. But I was, nevertheless surprised by their beauty; it is even more amazing in real life! I was also pleasantly surprised by the number of animal encounters we made along the way.

Would you recommend the short version of 'Nendaz trekking'

Yes, of course, without hesitation! I did, in fact, send lots of photos to my brother to encourage him to want to do the same. And with my boyfriend, we have promised ourselves to go walking in the mountains more often so that we can repeat an adventure like this and that next time it would be physically a little easier.

Endless hiking possibilities

There are countless trails to explore the many facets of Nendaz. They lead hikers across meadows and through forests, up to the mountain tops or along the «bisses».






Our top favourites

Nendaz Trekking

Nendaz Trekking is a «full package» walking tour. It offers hikers the opportunity to spend 3 or 4 days in the heart of the mountains between Nendaz and Veysonnaz. Everything is included in the package: overnight stays in mountain cabins (two or three depending on the option chosen), full board, a shuttle bus transferand a route logbook.




Dare to climb Rosablanche

Set off to climb the highest mountain in Nendaz: Rosablanche, which stands at an impressive 3,336 m above sea level. Our package includes equipment hire, one half-board overnight stay in a mountain cabin and the accompaniment of a mountain guide.

Pass Altitude


The Pass Altitude gives free access to the ski lifts of Nendaz and Veysonnaz for a choice of 3 to 12 days. It also entitles the holder to more than 200 francs worth of discounts. It is valid throughout the summer, so the holder can choose which dates to use it.

Cleuson Dam and Grand Désert Lake

From the Cleuson dam, which alone is worth the visit with its stunning turquoise water, experienced hikers continue their trek to the Grand Désert lake at 2,600 metres above sea level. Here the vegetation becomes more and more scarce as the landscape gradually changes to a mineral world that is truly unique.

Dent de Nendaz

The Dent de Nendaz is relatively easy to reach. It allows everyone to experience the satisfaction of reaching a real summit (2,462 metres). From Tracouet, which can be reached by gondola, a signposted mountain path takes less than an hour to climb. The effort is largely rewarded by the stunning panoramic view of the Lac Noir at the foot of the mountain, over the Alps opposite as well as the Rhone Valley below.


The Jardin Japonais (Japanese Gardens)

The Jardin Japonais (Japanese Garden), contrary to what its name might suggest, is an entirely natural site. Man's hand had nothing to do with it, but one might think so, as Mother Nature has created a masterpiece here, with alpine plants and streams meandering between the rocks. 

Bisses Delights

With Bisses Delights, the hiker takes the shuttle bus to Veysonnaz and then returns to Nendaz along two bisses stopping halfway to enjoy a 3-course menu featuring local delicacies in the charming hamlet of Planchouet.

Bisses Shuttle bus

This shuttle bus transports hikers to Veysonnaz, a neighbouring resort, opening new possibilities for walks such as the return to Nendaz via the bisses.

A testimony to our history

Nendaz boasts eight bisses, which represent a unique network of 98 km. Dug out of the ground, cut into or suspended from rock faces between 1435 and 1876, they bear witness to the history of the Nendards and their struggle to combat drought. Although the water of Nendaz has been bottled on a large scale since 1947, it has, for much longer, been diverted via the bisses to crops, particularly raspberries and apricots. Today, the bisses still fulfil this primary function of irrigation; six of them have water flowing within their banks every year during the summer months.

Pleasant walks

Situated between 700 and 2,300 metres above sea level, the bisses are a delight for walkers of all ages. The paths along them are popular walks along the water because they are traffic free, are relatively flat and are often shady.


Fun themed footpaths

They are a great way to go for a hike, have fun and learn more about the region. Several of them are especially designed for children:

- 1 The **panoramic path**: A 2.3 km walk at Tracouet with fun modules, educational information post, a picnic place, a photo point and above all, as its name implies, stunning panoramic views!
- 2 The barefoot path: After passing over troughs filled with sand, wood shavings, pebbles, pine cones, mosses, pine needles and logs to introduce walkers to this new experience, you are invited to go for a short 2.4 km barefoot walk along the riverbank.
- 3 The sculptures path: do you know of the devil of Sofleu or the wyvern of Louvie? All along this footpath, you can meet wooden sculptures representing creatures from our local legends. QR codes placed on each one allow walkers to read their story.







The Hérens cow path

How is cheese made? Why do cows wear bells? And why do Hérens cows fight? This fun and educational 4-kilometre footpath (downhill) answers these and many other questions via six child-friendly games.

If you want to see marmots, you have the choice of either getting up very early in the morning or waiting until the end of the day. In between, they take a very long nap out of sight. So the only time you might be lucky enough to see them is during their two daily feeding times. I arrive in Siviez at 4pm, with my 7-year-old daughter, and we are both impatient to discover the marmots. With a small group of about fifteen people, we follow Yvette, a mid-mountain guide.

pasture. On the way, I will tell you about how these mammals live throughout the year. And above all, we'll try to see some!» Although she cannot guarantee that we will spot any because this site is not a wildlife park, she is very confident because it is home to many individuals that are used to seeing hikers passing by in summer. They no longer run away at the slightest noise, but remain wild, nevertheless. It is out of the question to approach them too closely, so a little advice: remember to take binoculars (if you don't have any, Yvette


always takes two or three pairs with her, which she is happy to lend). And to put all the odds on your side, avoid shouting or running.

So here we are, on a pleasant loop of about 5 kilometres, punctuated by stops to observe the marmots and to listen to Yvette's very informative explanations. As I hope that you too will be able to enjoy this experience, I don't want to give away too much. She shared loads of very interesting information with us!

Did you know that marmots do not have the same number of claws on their front and back paws? That their calls have specific meanings? That in winter they go to the toilet together. That they have one burrow for winter and another for summer? We learned a lot more about these small mammals and about the surrounding flora. It was also the perfect opportunity to ask all our questions!

There remains the main concern we had before our departure: will we be able to see any marmots? Yes, and more like ten of them than just one! On several occasions, they did us the pleasure of showing themselves and we could even admire two babies, marmot pups, towards the end of our walk. Born in mid-June, they make their first outing two or three weeks later. It was such a joy to be lucky enough to spot them!

Panoramic platform

In a high mountain setting, the 360 degrees panoramic view opens out over several dozens of summits, among which are the most beautiful and amazing summits in the Alps such as the Matterhorn, Mont-Blanc, Grand Combin and Dent d'Hérens. A panoramic platform was inaugurated on the summit of Mont-Fort during winter 2023 so that everyone can safely enjoy this extraordinary view throughout both summer and winter.

The highest zipline in the world

With a top speed of more than 100 km/h and a departure at 3,330 m above sea level this zipline is truly unique! Departing from the emblematic Mont-Fort and soaring 1.4 km over a glacier with a drop of 323 metres. Great thrills guaranteed!

Sunrise at the Mont-Fort

To witness the first rays of the sun at 3,330 m above sea level is a breathtaking experience that rewards those who are brave enough to get out of bed before dawn.



Get on your (E-)bike!

Riding on mountain trails or along forest paths, going beyond your limits or simply getting away from it all, everything is possible! The development of electric bikes has made our routes, which for the most part are quite steep, accessible to a much larger number of mountain bikers. In addition to this, the ski lifts are equipped to transport bikes, allowing them to reach the summits with little effort if they wish.





Tour of the Mont-Fort

The Tour du Mont-Fort offers the possibility in one day to get close to the highest point of the ski domain while pedaling over rock fields, through pastures and Larch forests and generally exploring the heights of Nendaz, Verbier and La Tzoumaz.





Nendaz E-bike Tour

This special offer invites mountain bikers, with or without electric assistance, to embark on a two-day tour in the heart of the mountains. 
Mad Retreat Hotel NEW

In the past it was used to herd cattle and to communicate from one valley to another, but today the alphorn has become an instrument in its own right! A true love story links Nendaz to this instrument.

Initiation to the Alphorn


Everyone can learn to play the Alphorn in Nendaz, under the guidance of experienced musicians. There are discovery courses (2 hours) to learn more about its history, its manufacture and to succeed in producing a first sound, two-day introductory courses to play your first notes and five-day advanced courses for more accomplished players.

Our local heritage

In the Déserteur's footsteps

Charles-Frédéric Brun, nicknamed the «Deserter», arrived in Nendaz in the middle of the 19th century. He traded his colourful paintings for meals. He lived as a homeless man in fear of the police, hiding between Nendaz and the Val d'Hérens, until his death in 1871. A thematic footpath retraces his story along a walk between Haute-Nendaz, Basse-Nendaz and Saclentse.





The Herens cow

Hardy and adapted to our climate, the Hérens cows are excellent walkers who are able to move easily in difficult terrain. They fight by instinct to establish a hierarchy within the herd. Every spring, when they go up to the mountain pastures, they fight each other horn to horn. This natural aptitude has given rise to the organization of «combats de reines» which designates the «queen» of the herd.

Le Nînd'Art

Located in the heart of the village of Haute-Nendaz, the Nînd'Art is a space dedicated to the culture and heritage of Nendaz. Throughout the year, exhibitions and events are held here.



Escape Life

Amidst some unexpected and unusual places, some of which are usually closed to the public, players, working in teams, solve the riddles. The seven signs of the Apocalypse and the paintings of the Deserter, an emblematic character of Nendaz's history, help them to complete their mission. A fun and original way to explore the old quarters of the village and the hidden treasures of Nendaz.

Life on the mountain pastures begins early in the morning. This is the first lesson learned by my two daughters (5 and 2 years) and myself when at 7:30 am we meet in front of the Tourist Information Office to organize the carpooling for our outing. And again, when we arrive at Balavaux, where the day began quite a few hours before. The cheesemaker has been up since 4 am and has already done almost half a day's work.

After about 30 to 40 minutes travelling time, the group enjoys a few moments of the enchanting setting enhanced by the first rays of sunshine over the Alps. Then, it is the discovery of the dairy with its tank, large sink, its buckets, molds and its pipe to

hose down the floor.

The visit is therefore based on his schedule; he shares his daily life with us.

The cheesemaker gives us some explanations while continuing his tasks with practiced gestures. His morning is timed to the last detail. He has a mission to fulfill, namely the production of

about eight cheeses and 20 tommes (cream cheeses), with a procedure of tasks to be carried out in a precise order over a given period of time. The visit is therefore based on his schedule; he shares his daily life with us.

When we arrive, he is busy curdling the milk: using an instrument called a curd slice, he cuts the milk which has been transformed into curd beforehand, into firm cubes which will later be formed into cheese. This operation takes about 15 minutes. This is then stirred and heated gradually to 39° in 35 minutes, a semi-automatic operation that allows the cheesemaker to give us his full attention. We then visit the cellar and its 800 cheeses that have to be brushed and turned over every day. A short tour also through the mountain pastures where about 30 cows graze peacefully: they have already given about 200 litres of milk. Their cowshed, which we also discover, has been cleaned and is ready to welcome them once again in the evening. The cheesemaker then suggests we taste the «sérac», made from the whey. If at 8 am, I'm usually ready for bread and jam, in this context, I'm quite happy to have a taste.

He then takes the cheese out of the heating pot: to do so, he uses a simple strainer which retains the solid curds while letting the whey run back into the pot. This ancestral procedure has been made physically easier with the help of an automatic pulley. The contents of the strainer are then poured into molds to form the cheeses.

Finally, it's time for breakfast. A short walk leads us to the Balavaux cabin with its pretty red shutters and breathtaking views. A warm welcome and a wonderful breakfast spread on the table gets our mouths watering. 


